

worlds subsidy policy

The Experienced Subsidy

Note One: For the sake of clarity, this refers to anyone who is experienced straight after the *conclusion* of Canberra Easters on the 14 April. If Canberra was your second Easters, then you must satisfy the following criteria.

Note Two: This *does not* apply to any novices that come to be considered experienced at the conclusion of Wellington Australs – they are below.

Note Three: You do not need to do a mix, you can do the same thing twice (unless it doesn't occur twice, like camp), and this policy works retroactively for the calendar year.

Criteria A: On-Campus

Each experienced debater must complete TWO of the following:

- Adjudicate all rounds at a Mac Micro (or equivalent on-campus tournament)
 - Adjudicate/Convene/TAB all rounds at a Schools' Day (minus final)
 - Be the leader in a room for an on-campus Schools' Training Day
 - Be a mentor at MUDS Camp
 - Mentor at an entire MUDS Training Day
- in order to qualify for half of the subsidy.

Criteria B: Off-Campus

Each experienced debater must complete TWO of the following:

- Adjudicate all rounds (minus finals) off-campus tournament where novices are present
 - Debate all rounds at an off-campus tournament with novices in your team
 - Take novices to Sydney Regionals two or more times throughout the year
- in order to qualify for the second half of the subsidy.

The Novice Subsidy

Note One: Because novices have not been around as long, they have different priorities, namely to develop their skills. Thus, their burden is slightly different.

Note Two: You do not need to do a mix, you can do the same thing twice (unless it doesn't occur twice, like camp), and this policy works retroactively for the calendar year.

Criteria A: On-Campus

Each novice debater must complete TWO of the following:

- Adjudicate all rounds (minus finals) at a Schools' Day
- Attend MUDS Camp
- Attend a whole on-campus Training Day (e.g. Intro Day, Easters Training Day etc.)
- Debate or adjudicate all rounds (minus finals) at a Mac Micro or equivalent tournament

in order to qualify for half of the subsidy.

Criteria B: Off-Campus

Each novice debater must complete TWO of the following:

- Attend an intervarsity (Easters, Australs or Womens) as a debater or adjudicator
- Attend a non-Intervarsity tournament at another university (e.g. UNSW IV, ANU Spring, Sydney Grand Slam, Sydney Mini, ADAM etc.)
- Attend two or more Sydney Regionals across the year

in order to qualify for the second half of the subsidy.
